***We do not practise Intinction** (dipping the consecrated bread, or host, into the consecrated wine before consumption by the communicant) in this church. If you are unable to partake of the Common Cup, then it is legitimate to receive the host alone, since the body and blood are present in both species.*

***In case of an accident** during the service, if there is a trained medic in church, they should take control and others should remain in their seats. A churchwarden should call for an ambulance if needed and the accident book should be filled in. The service will continue as normal if at all possible.*

FIRST READING Isaiah 50.4-9a

God wants every knee to bow to Jesus – everyone in heaven, on earth and under the earth. Everyone will say, "Jesus Christ is Lord" and bring glory to God the Father.
