***We do not practise Intinction*** (dipping the consecrated bread, or host, into the consecrated wine before consumption by the communicant) in this church. *If you are unable to partake of the Common Cup then it is legitimate to receive the host alone, since the body and blood are present in both species.*

***Be aware of the step-up*** if you use the pews on the north and south walls – we don't want anyone falling.

***In case of an accident*** during the service if there is a trained medic in church they should take control and others should remain in their seats. A churchwarden should call for an ambulance if needed and the accident book should be filled in. The service will continue as normal if at all possible.

see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
