

*Feel free to ask the Priest before the service if you have any special intentions to be included in today's **Intercessions**.*

***We do not practise Intinction** (dipping the consecrated bread, or host, into the consecrated wine before consumption by the communicant) in this church. If you are unable to partake of the Common Cup then it is legitimate to receive the host alone, since the body and blood are present in both species.*

***Be aware of the step-up** if you use the pews on the north and south walls – we don't want anyone falling.*

***In case of an accident** during the service if there is a trained medic in church they should take control and others should remain in their seats. A churchwarden should call for an ambulance if needed and the accident book should be filled in. The service will continue as normal if at all possible.*

The Lord showed me that the men of my own town were making plans against me. He showed me what they were doing, so I knew they were against me. Before he showed me this, I was like a gentle lamb unaware it would be killed. I did not understand that they were against me. They were saying this about me: "Let us destroy the tree and its fruit! Let us kill him! Then people will forget him." So I prayed, "Lord All-Powerful, you are a fair judge. You know how to test people's hearts and minds. I will tell you my arguments, and I will leave you to give them the punishment they deserve."
