*Please feel free to ask the Priest before the service if you have any special intentions to be included in today's **Intercessions**.*

**We do not practise Intinction** (dipping the consecrated bread, or host, into the consecrated wine by the communicant) in this church. If you are unable to partake of the Common Cup, then it is legitimate to receive the host alone.

**Be aware of the step-up** if you use the pews on the north and south walls.

**In case of an accident** during the service if there is a trained medic in church they should take control and others should remain in their seats. A churchwarden should call for an ambulance if needed and the accident book should be filled in. The service will continue as normal if at all possible.

We especially welcome Lilah and her family and friends to today's service. For this candidate baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God, which continues for the rest of her life, the first step in response to God's love. This is a joyful moment when we all rejoice in what God has done for us in Christ, making serious promises and declaring the faith. The wider community of All Saints and friends welcome this candidate as a new Christian, promising support and prayer for her future. We also remember our own baptism and reflect on the progress made on that journey, which is now to be shared with this new member of the Church.

The service paints many vivid pictures of what happens on the Christian way:



**The cross**

A badge of  
Christian faith and a  
reminder of Christ's  
death for us.



**Water**

Our 'drowning' in the  
water of baptism,  
where we believe we  
die to sin and are  
raised to new life,  
unites us to Christ's  
dying and rising.  
Water is also a sign of  
new life, as we  
are born again by water  
and the Spirit.



**A candle**

A sign of that new life,  
a picture of the light of  
Christ conquering  
the darkness of evil.

We journey through the baptism service: from the **altar** to the **font**, then back for a lit **candle**, immediately before being sent out on our journey.

**Everyone who is baptised walks in that light for the rest of their lives.**

As you pray for the candidates, picture them with you and the whole Church throughout the ages, journeying into the fullness of God's love.

## **READING** Hebrews 11.29-12.2

By faith the people of Israel passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets – who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won

strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented – of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground.

Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

## **BAPTISM: PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE & DECISION**

Faith is the gift of God to his people.  
In baptism the Lord is adding to our number  
those whom he is calling.

*To the congregation:*

People of God,  
will you welcome this candidate  
and uphold her in her new life in Christ?

**All With the help of God, we will.**

*To parents and godparents:*

Parents and godparents,  
the Church receives this candidate with joy.  
Today we are trusting God for her growth in faith.

Will you pray for her,  
draw her by your example into the community of faith  
and walk with her in the way of Christ?

**With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism this candidate begins her journey in faith.  
You speak for her today.

Will you care for her,  
and help her to take her place  
within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

**With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.  
To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?  
**I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?  
**I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?  
**I repent of them.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?  
**I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?  
**I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?  
**I come to Christ.**

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John  
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,  
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

In it we are buried with Christ in his death.  
By it we share in his resurrection.  
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.  
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,  
we baptise into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

by the power of your Holy Spirit,  
they may be cleansed from sin and born again.  
Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith  
and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;  
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit
