*Please feel free to ask the Priest before the service if you have any special intentions to be included in today's **Intercessions**.*

**We do not practise Intinction** (dipping the consecrated bread, or host, into the consecrated wine by the communicant) in this church. If you are unable to partake of the Common Cup, then it is legitimate to receive the host alone.

**Be aware of the step-up** if you use the pews on the north and south walls.

**In case of an accident** during the service if there is a trained medic in church they should take control and others should remain in their seats. A churchwarden should call for an ambulance if needed and the accident book should be filled in. The service will continue as normal if at all possible.

We especially welcome Ferne, Lucas and their families and friends to today's service. For these candidates baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God, which continues for the rest of their lives, the first step in response to God's love. This is a joyful moment when we all rejoice in what God has done for us in Christ, making serious promises and declaring the faith. The wider community of All Hallows and friends welcome these candidates as new Christians, promising support and prayer for their future. We also remember our own baptism and reflect on the progress made on that journey, which is now to be shared with these new members of the Church.

The service paints many vivid pictures of what happens on the Christian way:



**The cross**

A badge of  
Christian faith and a  
reminder of Christ's  
death for us.



**Water**

Our 'drowning' in the  
water of baptism,  
where we believe we  
die to sin and are  
raised to new life,  
unites us to Christ's  
dying and rising.  
Water is also a sign of  
new life, as we  
are born again by water  
and the Spirit.



**A candle**

A sign of that new life,  
a picture of the light of  
Christ conquering  
the darkness of evil.

We journey through the baptism service: from the **altar** to the **font**, then back for a lit **candle**, immediately before being sent out on our journey.

**Everyone who is baptised walks in that light for the rest of their lives.**

As you pray for the candidates, picture them with you and the whole Church throughout the ages, journeying into the fullness of God's love.

## READING 1 Peter 4.12-19

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that is taking place among you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice in so far as you are sharing Christ's sufferings, so that you may also be glad and shout for joy when his glory is revealed. If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory, which is the Spirit of God, is resting on you. But let none of you suffer as a murderer, a thief, a criminal, or even as a mischief-maker. Yet if any of you suffers as a Christian, do not consider it a disgrace, but glorify God because you bear this name. For the time has come for judgement to begin with the household of God; if it begins with us, what will be the end for those who do not obey the gospel of God? And 'If it is hard for the righteous to be saved, what will become of the ungodly and the sinners?'

## **BAPTISM: PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES & DECISION**

Faith is the gift of God to his people.  
In baptism the Lord is adding to our number  
those whom he is calling.

*To the congregation:*

People of God,  
will you welcome these candidates  
and uphold them in their new life in Christ?

**All With the help of God, we will.**

*To parents and godparents:*

Parents and godparents,  
the Church receives these candidates with joy.  
Today we are trusting God for their growth in faith.

Will you pray for them,  
draw them by your example into the community of faith  
and walk with them in the way of Christ?

**With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism these candidates begin their journey in faith.  
You speak for them today.

Will you care for them,  
and help them to take their place  
within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

**With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.  
To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?  
**I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?  
**I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?  
**I repent of them.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?  
**I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?  
**I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?  
**I come to Christ.**

## **BAPTISM: SIGNING WITH THE CROSS**

*The minister makes the sign of the cross on each candidate's forehead, saying*

Christ claims you for his own.  
Receive the sign of his cross.  
Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

and remain faithful to Christ  
to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,  
restore in you the image of his glory,  
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

## **BAPTISM: PRAYER OVER THE WATER**

*The ministers and the candidates gather at the font.*

**All**     Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
**who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**All**     **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water  
to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved  
in the beginning of creation.  
Through water you led the children of Israel  
from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.  
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John  
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,  
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.  
In it we are buried with Christ in his death.  
By it we share in his resurrection.  
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.  
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,  
we baptise into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that,  
by the power of your Holy Spirit,  
they may be cleansed from sin and born again.  
Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith  
and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;  
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit  
be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

Dear *[Candidate]*
