READING James 5.13-20

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. Elijah was a human being like us, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. Then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth yielded its harvest.

My brothers and sisters, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, you should know that whoever brings back a sinner from wandering will save the sinner's soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

At the end the reader may say:

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Silence may be kept.

GOSPEL READING Mark 9.38-50

The Lord be with you, and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

John said to Jesus, 'Teacher, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us.' But Jesus said, 'Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterwards to speak evil of me. Whoever is not against us is for us. For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward.

If any of you put a stumbling-block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck, and you were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and to go to hell, to the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than to have two feet and to be thrown into hell. And if your

eye causes you to stumble, tear it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell, where their worm never dies, and the fire is never quenched.

For everyone will be salted with fire. Salt is good; but if salt has lost its saltiness, how can you season it? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

SERMON

After the Sermon silence may be kept.

PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTISM CANDIDATE

Moving to the font the minister is joined by the baptism candidate, parents and godparents. The congregation turn to face the font.

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

We thank God for *Theodore* who has come to be baptised today.
Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church.

So I ask you all:

Will you support *Theodore* as he begins his journey of faith? We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family? **We will**.

The minister asks the parents and godparents:

God knows each of us by name and we are his.

Parents and godparents, you speak for *Theodore* today. Will you pray for him, and help him to follow Christ?

Parents and godparents reply:

We will.

Will you support him on his journey of faith? **We will.**

THE DECISION

The minister says to parents and godparents:

We all wander far from God and lose our way. Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask you parents and godparents:

Do you turn away from sin?

Parents and godparents reply:

I do.

Do you reject evil?

I do.

Do you turn to Christ as saviour?

I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord?

I do.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The minister makes the sign of the cross using the oil of Chrism on the forehead of the candidate, saying:

Theodore, Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ crucified.

You are his forever.

Stand bravely with him against all powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. Amen.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of the your Son Jesus. He was baptised in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him.

Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptised in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever.

Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Let us affirm, together with *Theodore* who is being baptised, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.
This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God:
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

BAPTISM

The minister pours water on the candidate, saying:

Theodore,
I baptise you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

WELCOME AND PEACE

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism. By one Spirit we are all baptised into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

We are all one in Christ Jesus. We belong to him through faith, heirs of the promise of the Spirit of peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you, and also with you.

GIVING OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

The minister gives the baptised a candle lit from the Paschal (Easter) candle, saying:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light.

Theodore, you have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life. Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

HYMN
