READING Hebrews 5.1-10

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; as he says also in another place, 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.'

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

At the end the reader may say:

This is the word of the Lord.
Thanks be to God.

Silence may be kept.

GOSPEL READING Mark 10.35-45

So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

THE PRESENTATION

The Incumbent stands before the Bishop with the Assistant Priest, the Churchwardens flanking them, and says

Bishop John, I present Rev Christine Ostler, to serve as Assistant Priest of the Parish Churches of All Saints and All Hallows in Wellingborough.

Bishop I thank you for your presentation.
Churchwardens and people of these parishes:
Do you welcome Rev Christine to continue to serve here?
We do.

Bishop Will you continue to support and uphold Rev Christine in her ministry?
With the help of God, we will.

Bishop Will you share with her in worship and witness,
mission and pastoral care?
With the help of God, we will.

Bishop Rev Christine, I ask you in the presence of this congregation:
Are you willing to continue in this ministry?

Priest I am.

THE LICENSING

Declaration and Oaths

The congregation remains seated.

Bishop The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer, and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and in making him known to those in your care?

Priest I, Rev Christine Ostler, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

The Priest takes the Bible in her right hand and faces the people.

Priest I, Rev Christine Ostler, do swear by almighty God that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, her heirs and successors, according to law: so help me God.

Still holding the Bible the Priest faces the Bishop.

Priest I, Rev Christine Ostler, do swear by almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Peterborough and his successors in all things lawful and honest: so help me God.

The Priest signs the Declaration and Oaths then kneels before the Bishop.

Licensing

Bishop I ask you now to join me in prayer for Rev Christine, that God may bless her in her ministry, so that Christ may be shown forth in your witness together in this place.

A period of silent prayer.

Bishop Almighty God,
who on the Day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit
to the disciples with the wind from heaven and in tongues of flame,
filling them with joy and boldness to proclaim your gospel,
hear our prayer for Rev Christine and for all your faithful people,
that in the power of the same Spirit,
we may witness to your truth, and draw all to the fire of your love;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

The Bishop reads the Licence, then hands it to the Associate Priest and blesses her saying

Bishop God give you grace to fulfil your ministry,
reverence in the celebration of the sacraments,
faithfulness in proclaiming the word,
zeal in mission, diligence in pastoral care,
tenderness in comforting,
power in healing the wounds of his people,
and humility, self-sacrifice and courage in all things.
May you follow the steps of our Lord
and lead others in the way of eternal joy.
Amen.

PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTISM CANDIDATES

Moving to the font the Bishop is joined by the baptism candidates, parents and godparents. The congregation turn to face the font.

Faith is the gift of God to his people.
In baptism the Lord is adding to our number
those whom he is calling.

We thank God for *Coco Olive* and *Edward Theodore Thomas*
who have come to be baptised today.
Christ loves them and welcomes them into his Church.

So I ask you all:

Will you support *Coco* and *Teddy* as they begin their journey of faith?
We will.

Will you help them to live and grow within God's family?

We will.

The Bishop asks the parents and godparents:

God knows each of us by name and we are his.

Parents and godparents, you speak for *Coco* and *Teddy* today.

Will you pray for them, and help them to follow Christ?

Parents and godparents reply:

We will.

Will you support them on their journey of faith?

We will.

THE DECISION

The Bishop says to parents and godparents:

We all wander far from God and lose our way.

Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.

In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask you parents and godparents:

Do you turn away from sin?

Parents and godparents reply:

I do.

Do you reject evil?

I do.

Do you turn to Christ as saviour?

I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord?

I do.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The Bishop makes the sign of the cross using the oil of Chrism on the forehead of the candidates, saying:

[N], Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ crucified. You are his forever.

**Stand bravely with him against all powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.
Amen.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

We praise you, loving Father,
for the gift of the your Son Jesus.

He was baptised in the River Jordan,
where your Spirit came upon him
and revealed him as the Son you love.
He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him.

Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water,
that those who are baptised in it
may be cleansed in the water of life,
and, filled with your Spirit,
may know that they are loved as your children,
safe in Christ for ever.

Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Let us affirm,
together with *Coco* and *Teddy* who are being baptised,

The Bishop gives the baptised a candle lit from the Paschal (Easter) candle, saying:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness
and has given us a place with the saints in light.

Coco, Teddy, you have received the light of Christ;
walk in this light all the days of your life.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.
