READING 2 Thessalonians 1

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, to the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing. Therefore we ourselves boast of you among the churches of God for

your steadfastness and faith during all your persecutions and the afflictions that you are enduring.

This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God and is intended to make you worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are also suffering. For it is indeed just of God to repay with affliction those who afflict you and to give relief to the afflicted as well as to us, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in a fiery flame, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. CONFIRMATION

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The candidates may be presented to the congregation. Where appropriate, they may be presented by their godparents or sponsors.

The bishop asks the candidates:

Bishop Have you been baptised

in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit?

Candidate I have.

Bishop Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart

to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

Candidate I am.

The bishop addresses the whole congregation:

Bishop People of God, will you welcome these candidates

and uphold them in their life in Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

DECISION

A large candle is lit. The bishop addresses all the candidates:

Bishop In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore Lask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

Candidate I reject them.

Bishop Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

Candidate I renounce them.

Bishop Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

Candidate I repent of them.

Bishop Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

Candidate I turn to Christ.

Bishop Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

Candidate I submit to Christ.

Bishop Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

Candidate I come to Christ.

Bishop May God who has given you the desire to follow Christ

give you strength to continue in the Way.

All Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The ministers and candidates for confirmation gather at the baptismal font. The bishop blesses the water.

The bishop addresses the congregation:

Bishop Brothers and sisters,

I ask you to profess

together with these candidates

the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

All I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the Virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried;

he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

All I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The bishop sprinkles the candidates with water and then says:

Bishop Almighty God,

we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith

with all who have been baptised into your name.

Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

All Amen.

The bishop and the candidates gather at the place of confirmation.

CONFIRMATION

The bishop stands before those who are to be confirmed, and says:

Bishop Our help is in the name of the Lord Who has made heaven and earth.

Bishop Blessed be the name of the Lord

All now and for ever. Amen.

The bishop extends his hands towards those to be confirmed and says

Bishop Almighty and ever-living God,

you have given these your servants new birth

in baptism by water and the Spirit, and have forgiven them all their sins. Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding; the Spirit of counsel and inward strength;

the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord.

All Amen.

The bishop addresses each candidate by name:

Bishop N, God has called you by name and made you his own.

The bishop anoints each candidate with the Oil of Chrism as a sign of God's anointing Spirit. He then lays his hand on the head of each, saying:

Bishop Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The bishop invites the congregation to pray for all those on whom hands have been laid.

All Defend, O Lord, these your servants with your heavenly grace, that they may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until they come to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

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LICENSING OF AN ASSISTANT PRIEST

PRESENTATION OF THE PRIEST

The incumbent stands before the bishop with the priest.

Incumbent Bishop Donald, I present to you Revd Canon John Westwood to be licensed as Assistant Priest in this benefice.

Bishop I thank you for your presentation

and pray that God's blessing may rest on the decisions

made in his Name.

The bishop addresses the priest:

Bishop John, do you believe, so far as you know your own heart,

that God has called you to this ministry?

Priest I believe that God has called me.

The incumbent returns to her seat.

DECLARATION AND THE OATHS OF ALLEGIANCE AND CANONICAL OBEDIENCE

Bishop The care of a Parish and its people is a sacred trust.

John, do you, in the presence of this congregation,

commit yourself to share in this trust and responsibility?

Priest I do.

Bishop Will you who witness this new beginning

support and uphold your assistant priest

and will you commit yourselves to work with him in his ministry?

All We will.

Bishop Will you now make the Declaration

and take the Oaths which are required by law?

Priest I will.

Archdeacon The Church of England is part of the One, Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scripture and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation.

Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer, and the Ordering of Bishops, Priest and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and in making him known to those in your care?

Priest

I, John Richard Westwood, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

The priest takes the Bible in his right hand.

Priest

I, John Richard Westwood, do swear by Almighty God that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles the Third, his heirs and successors, according to law. So help me God.

I, John Richard Westwood, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Peterborough and his successors, in all things lawful and honest. So help me God.

The priest subscribes the Declaration and the Oaths and then kneels before the bishop.

Bishop

I ask you now to join me in prayer for Revd Canon John that God may bless him in his work, so that God's presence may be shown forth in your witness together in this place.

All kneel and pray. The bishop concludes the time of prayer with these words:

Bishop

Almighty God, who on the Day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit to the disciples with the wind from heaven and in tongues of flame, filling them with joy and boldness to proclaim your Gospel, hear our prayer for Revd Canon John Westwood and for all your faithful people, that in the power of the same Spirit, we may witness to your truth, and draw all to the fire of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

All sit.

LICENSING

The churchwardens stand beside the priest, who remains kneeling.

A churchwarden says:

Warden Bishop Donald, on behalf of the parishioners of this benefice

we ask you to license Revd Canon John Westwood

as our Assistant Priest.

We believe that he is well qualified

and that he has been prayerfully and lawfully selected.

Bishop Brothers and sisters in Christ, is it your will

that John should be licensed as Assistant Priest in this benefice?

All It is.

The churchwardens return to their places.

The bishop is seated and the priest kneels before him. The bishop reads the Licence, and delivers it to the new assistant priest.

Bishop John, receive the Cure of Souls which is both yours and mine;

in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The bishop blesses the priest:

Bishop God give you grace to fulfil your ministry,

reverence in celebrating the sacraments, faithfulness in proclaiming the word,

zeal in mission.

diligence in pastoral care, tenderness in comforting,

power in healing the wounds of his people,

and humility, self-sacrifice and courage in all things.

May you follow the steps of our Lord and lead others in the way of eternal joy.

All Amen.
