THE EASTER CANDLE

The ministers remain at the back of the church for the lighting of the Easter candle.

Minister Christ yesterday and today,
All the beginning and the end,

Minister Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages;
All to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. Amen.

Minister By his holy and glorious wounds

The president lights the Easter candle with a taper, saying:

Minister May the light of Christ, rising in glory,
 banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The ministers and the candle bearer pause at the font, halfway down the church, and at the front. The candle is raised each time as the deacon says:

Deacon The light of Christ.
All Thanks be to God.

The candle is placed in the stand and the altar candles are lit from the Paschal candle as the minister says:

This is the day
when our Lord Jesus Christ was raised gloriously from the dead,
crushing the power of sin and destroying the sting of death.

Throughout the world Christians celebrate the mighty power of God
as Christ calls us out of darkness to share in his marvellous light.

May we, and all Christ's people,
shine as lights in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

All He is risen indeed. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

INTRODUCTION

Minister Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us
that to enter the kingdom of heaven
we must be born again of water and the Spirit,
and has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth.

Here we are washed by the Holy Spirit, and made clean.
Here we are clothed with Christ,
dying to sin that we may live his risen life.
As children of God, we have a new dignity,
and God calls us to fullness of life.

COLLECT

Minister Heavenly Father, by the power of your Holy Spirit
you give to your faithful people new life in the water of baptism.
Guide and strengthen us by the same Spirit,
that we who are born again may serve you in faith and love,
and grow into the full stature of your Son Jesus Christ,
who is alive and reigns with you
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

READING Acts 10.34-43

Peter began to speak to those assembled in the house of Cornelius.

'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ – he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

Silence may be kept.

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men.

But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, "He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him." This is my message for you.'

REFLECTION ON BAPTISM

After the Reflection silence may be kept.

PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTISM CANDIDATE

The minister invites the baptism candidate, parents and godparents to join them.

Minister Faith is the gift of God to his people.

In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

We thank God for *Hettie*,

who has come to be baptised today.

Christ loves her and welcomes her into his Church.

So I ask you all:

Will you support *Hettie* as she begins her journey of faith?

All **We will.**

Will you help her to live and grow within God's family?
All We will.

The minister asks the parents and godparents:

God knows each of us by name and we are his.

Parents and godparents, you speak for *Hettie* today.
Will you pray for her, and help her to follow Christ?

Parents and godparents reply:

We will.

Minister Will you support her on her journey of faith?
We will.

THE DECISION

Minister We all wander far from God and lose our way.
Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.
In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask you:
Do you turn away from sin?

Parents and godparents reply:

I do.

Minister Do you reject evil?
I do.

Minister Do you turn to Christ as saviour?
I do.

Minister Do you trust in him as Lord?
I do.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The minister makes the sign of the cross using the oil of Chrism on the forehead of the candidate, saying:

Minister *Hettie*, Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.
Do not be ashamed of Christ crucified. You are his forever.

When the candidate has received the sign of the cross, we say together:

**All Stand bravely with him against all powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

Minister May almighty God
deliver you from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

All Amen.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

The minister, candidates, parents and godparents move to the font, the congregation turns towards the font:

Minister We praise you, loving Father,
for the gift of your Son Jesus.
He was baptised in the River Jordan,
where your Spirit came upon him
and revealed him as the Son you love.
He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him.

Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water,
that those who are baptised in it
may be cleansed in the water of life,
and, filled with your Spirit,
may know that they are loved as your children,
safe in Christ for ever.

All Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Minister Let us affirm,
together with *Hettie* who is being baptised,
our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,
source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

All I believe and trust in him.

Minister Do you believe and trust in God the Son
who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

All I believe and trust in him.

Minister Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit
who gives life to the people of God
and makes Christ known in the world?

All I believe and trust in him.

Minister This is the faith of the Church.

All This is our faith.
 We believe and trust in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

BAPTISM

The minister pours water on the candidate, saying:

Minister *Hettie*, I baptise you in the name of the Father,
 and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

After each candidate is baptised the congregation respond:

All **Amen.**

Minister *Hettie*, today God has touched you with his love
 and given you a place among his people.
 God promises to be with you in joy and in sorrow,
 to be your guide in life,
 and to bring you safely to heaven.
 In baptism God invites you on a life-long journey.

 Together with all God's people
 you must explore the way of Jesus
 and grow in friendship with God,
 in love for his people,
 and in serving others.

 With us you will listen to the word of God
 and receive the gifts of God.

WELCOME AND PEACE

Minister There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism.
 By one Spirit we are all baptised into one body.

All **We welcome you into the fellowship of faith;
 we are children of the same heavenly Father;
 we welcome you.**

Minister We are all one in Christ Jesus.
 We belong to him through faith,
 heirs of the promise of the Spirit of peace.

 The peace of the Lord be always with you,
