



Maundy Thursday Benefice Service All Saints Church

Welcome to worship at All Saints Church this Maundy Thursday. Whether a visitor or regular we are delighted that you are here with us.

Our worship this evening marks the start of the Easter Triduum, the greatest festival of the church year, during which we recount the last three days of Jesus' life.

On his final night with his disciples, Jesus instituted the Eucharist, and commanded his disciples to wash one another's feet, a command (mandatum in Latin), from which we get the name Maundy Thursday. In the Liturgy of Maundy Thursday, feet of members of the congregation are washed by the presiding priest in an act of humble Christian service; we give thanks for the gift of Christ's presence with us in Holy Communion and pray that his life of loving service may abide in all of us.

After the Last Supper, Jesus and his disciples went out to the Garden of Gethsemane, to watch and pray, where Jesus was arrested. After the Stripping of the Altars and the reading of the Gospel of the Watch, both of which recall Christ's arrest, we, too, will have the opportunity to stay awhile, to watch and pray with the Lord, in the Lady Chapel after this service. At the end of the service the congregation leave in silence, but all are invited to remain in the Lady Chapel for some or all of the Watch. This will end at 10pm.

Reception of Holy Oils

Minister Brothers and sisters, on this most holy night we enter into the three days of the celebration of our Lord's paschal victory, his death and resurrection. As we begin, we receive from our bishop Debbie the holy oils blessed and set apart for the sacramental life of our parish.

Each oil is presented by the Deacon at the altar.

Deacon The oil of the sick.

Minister By the laying on of hands and anointing with this oil, and with the prayerful support of this community, may those who are sick experience the healing presence of Christ.

All Amen.

Deacon The oil of baptism.

Minister Anointed with this oil, and assisted by the example of this community, may those who are to be baptised know that Christ calls them by name and makes them his own and shares with them his victory over sin and the power of evil.

All Amen.

Deacon The oil of chrism.

Minister Anointed with this fragrant oil, may all who are baptized and confirmed, all who are ordained to the service of God's people, and this community whose house of prayer is dedicated to God's glory, fill the world with the sweet fragrance of Christ's gospel and be built up as living stones into a temple filled with the Holy Spirit.

Prayers of Penitence

We remain standing as the President introduces the prayers of penitence with these or other suitable words:

Deacon Our Lord Jesus Christ says:
'If you love me, keep my commandments.'
'Unless I wash you, you have no part in me.'

Let us confess to almighty God our sins against his love,
and ask him to cleanse us.

Silence is kept.

Minister Have mercy on us, O God,
in your great goodness;
according to the abundance of your compassion
blot out our offences.
Lord, have mercy.

Minister Against you only have we sinned
and done what is evil in your sight.
Christ have mercy,

All Christ have mercy.

Minister Purge us from our sin and we shall be clean;
wash us and we shall be whiter than snow.
Lord, have mercy

All Lord, have mercy.

The president uses this or another authorised form of absolution:

Minister May the Father forgive you
by the death of his Son,
and strengthen you
to live in the power of the Spirit
all your days.

We remain standing to sing

Collect

The minister introduces a period of silent prayer with the words:

Minister Let us pray that we may love one another
as Christ has loved us.

Silence is kept.

Minister God our Father,
you have invited us to share in the supper
which your Son gave to his Church
to proclaim his death until he comes:
may he nourish us by his presence,
and unite us in his love;
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

All Amen.

The congregation sit for our first Bible reading.

First reading Exodus 12.1-4, 11-14

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt:

This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for

each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly.

It is the passover of the LORD. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

This is the word of the Lord.

The congregation sit for our second Bible reading.

Second reading 1 Corinthians 11.23-26

Beloved, I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'

In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

Silence may be kept.

Gospel reading John 13.1-17, 31b-35

We remain standing for the Gospel reading, turning to face the Gospel book.

Choir/All Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

Cantor I give you a new commandment, says the Lord:
Love one another as I have loved you.

Choir/All Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

Deacon Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him.

And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, 'Lord, are you going to wash my feet?' Jesus answered, 'You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand.' Peter said to him, 'You will never wash my feet.' Jesus answered, 'Unless I wash you, you have no share with me.' Simon Peter said to him, 'Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!' Jesus said to him, 'One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you.' For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, 'Not all of you are clean.'

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, 'Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord - and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them. Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you

cannot come." I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Sermon

After the Sermon silence is kept.

The washing of feet

Those whose feet are to be washed, come forward and sit on the front pews. While the foot washing takes place the choir will sing 'Ubi Caritas'.

After the foot washing is complete the following prayer is used:

Minister Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us
that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters
we do also for you:
give us the will to be the servant of others
as you were the servant of all,
and gave up your life and died for us,
but are alive and reign, now and for ever.

All Amen.

Prayers of Intercession

Minister In the power of the Spirit let us pray to the Father
through Christ the saviour of the world.

Father, on this, the night he was betrayed,
your Son Jesus Christ washed his disciples' feet.
We commit ourselves to follow his example of love and service.
Lord, hear us,

All and humble us.

Minister On this night, he prayed for his disciples to be one.
We pray for the unity of your Church.

Lord, hear us,

All and unite us.

Minister On this night, he prayed for those who were to believe through his disciples' message.

We pray for the mission of your Church.

Lord, hear us,

All and renew our zeal.

Minister On this night, he commanded his disciples to love, but suffered rejection himself.

We pray for the rejected and unloved.

Lord, hear us,

All and fill us with your love.

Minister On this night, he reminded his disciples that if the world hated them it hated him first.

We pray for those who are persecuted for their faith.

Lord, hear us,

All and give us your peace.

Minister On this night, he accepted the cup of death and looked forward to the new wine of the kingdom.

We remember those who have died in the peace of Christ.

Lord, hear us,

All and welcome all your children into paradise.

Peace

The congregation are invited to stand for the Peace.

Minister Jesus says:

Preparation of the table

We remain standing for the table prayer and the Eucharistic Prayer.

Minister At the eucharist we are with our crucified and risen Lord.

We know that it was not only our ancestors,

so our Lord is here with us now.

All **Until the kingdom of God comes
let us celebrate this feast.**

you create the fruit of the vine.

Eucharistic Prayer

Minister The Lord be with you,

Minister It is indeed right to give you thanks,

Father most holy,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

For on this night he girded himself with a towel
and, taking the form of a servant,
washed the feet of his disciples.

He gave us a new commandment
that we should love one another as he has loved us.

Knowing that his hour had come,
in his great love he gave this supper to his disciples
to be a memorial of his passion,
that we might proclaim his death until he comes again,
and feast with him in his kingdom.

Therefore earth unites with heaven
to sing a new song of praise;
we too join with angels and archangels
as they proclaim your glory without end:

this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

rising you restored our life.

Minister And so, Father,
calling to mind his death on the cross,
his perfect sacrifice made once

As we offer you this
our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving,
we bring before you this bread and this cup
and we thank you for counting us worthy
to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people
and gather into one in your kingdom
all who share this one bread and one cup,
so that we, in the company of all the saints,
may praise and glorify you for ever,
through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father,
for ever and ever.

The Lord's Prayer

Minister As our Saviour taught us, with confidence we pray.

All Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come,

on earth as it is in heaven.

Breaking of the bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

Minister Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup,

All we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Agnus Dei

Choir/All Jesus, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world:
have mercy on us [x2].

Jesus, bread of life, you take away the sins of the world:
have mercy on us [x2].

Jesus, wine of joy, you take away the sins of the world:
grant us your peace [x4].

Giving of Communion

Minister Jesus is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All **Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

If you are a visitor from another church where you normally receive communion, you are most welcome to receive communion with us today. If you prefer to come forward simply to receive a blessing, then it is helpful if you bring this service booklet with you to indicate that is what you want. Please wait to be directed forward to receive communion.

During the distribution of communion hymns/anthem will be sung.

Prayer after Communion

We sit or kneel for the prayer.

Minister Lord Jesus Christ,
we thank you that in this wonderful sacrament
you have given us the memorial of your passion:
grant us so to reverence the sacred mysteries
of your body and blood
that we may know within ourselves
and show forth in our lives
the fruit of your redemption,
for you are alive and reign, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

The Blessed Sacrament is censed. The priest puts on the Hymnal Veil before processing with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose in the Lady Chapel.

As the Sacrament is processed, the Sanctus bells will be rung and the choir will sing in plain song. Once the Sacrament is in place the bell will stop. The clergy will remove their vestments in silence and return to the nave.

Conclusion – the stripping of the Sanctuary

When the clergy are returned, as the choir sing Psalm 69, the altars are stripped, and the lights dimmed.

When the stripping of the altar is complete, the Gospel of the Watch will be read from the pulpit. At the end of the Gospel the clergy, choir and congregation leave in silence to join the Watch in the Lady Chapel, which will end with Compline at 9.45pm
